Stavely Block 10 Project Update

WIM Resource Pty Ltd (WIM) is continuing our exploration program for the Staveley Block 10 Project (EL 6873) following on from 2021 which saw a three-week exploratory drilling program in February and an aeromagnetic survey in May.

In January this year WIM successfully completed a low impact geophysical survey using a local Horsham-based contractor. Using a technique known as Gravity, measurements are collected from the gravitational field at a series of different locations over a number of areas of interest. This helped define the underlying geology using variations in rock density and the results inform further drilling.

WIM will conduct further low impact exploration in 2022 beginning mid-February for two weeks and mid-March for a further two weeks. These air-core drilling programs will be carried out across various sites within the project area and wherever practical, on public road reserves.

Over the last couple of months the Brigade and its members have been kept reasonably busy. Mostly supporting call-outs to fires in the Green Lake and

Wonwondah areas. Plus our Brigade has supplied members for strike teams supporting the Poolaijelo New Year's Eve fire which burnt over 7,300ha and also the Edenhope fire a couple of weeks ago. Locally we've had a call-out to a rescue where a vehicle was stuck on the edge of Carter's Track, and also a lightning strike on our property. Massive thanks to those who attended.

A big shout out for everyone who has made themselves available to go on the strike teams and continually responding for our local fires. The season is far from over, so your continued efforts to respond will be greatly appreciated.

COVID 19 - Just a reminder to be Covid safe. QR Code check-ins are still required at the stations. With a few cases popping up locally, please let your captain know if you unfortunately do catch Covid. This way we can work around the situation if your property does get impacted by fire or if you are unable to attend.

Let's face it, we have to live with it now and precautions are a part of life, and every effort to reduce the impact is vital in the community. It's kept confidential, but it also helps us know our available members in the event of a fire.

Training - Things have been kept quiet on the training front because of the fire danger period. We've had a couple of people show interest in becoming a brigade member, which is great.

General fire fighter courses are planned for District 17 for anyone who wishes to join up. Please contact myself or our Training Officer, Francoise Thornton Smith if you'd like to join up or for any other training queries.

Supplementary Alerting Service (SAS) app Thanks to everyone who has downloaded this free
app. Without sounding like a broken record, just
another reminder to all members we ask that you
download the SAS app to receive all pager
messages. A very useful app to help all members be
notified of incidents and respond when available.
Passwords have been made up for most members
of the Brigade, so please contact me if you wish to
get this app.

Harvest - With harvest completed, from what I can gather the Grampians Group only had one harvest related fire that was reported. Great work by all the farmers and contractors to keep us virtually fire-free.

With a couple of Total Fire Ban days and a couple of 'blow up days' we appreciate everyone's cooperation to cease harvest when required. It can be frustrating at times but it's all about stopping a major fire starting which provides more inconvenience for many others.

Fire Safety and Prevention - With many farmers taking on stubble mulching and paddock preparations for burning off, please note the rules & regulations when using machinery in paddocks with extinguishers and firefighting units in paddocks etc.

With the few storms we've had, please continue to clean up around your properties and check gutters for material build up.

We've had a relatively quiet summer locally, so let's do our bit to keep it that way by thinking 'fire safety'.

Process for Notifying Covid Positive Member or Close Contact Isolating for CFA Volunteers - If you have a confirmed

case of Covid (either via RAT or PCR) or are isolating due to exposure, **you must immediately notify your Brigade Captain** and isolate according to Department of Health requirements.

Then, please use the CFA Members website to notify CFA that you are currently isolating due to being Covid Positive or a close contact. You can call or text me to do this on your behalf. This helps to manage brigade capability to turn out.

If you have attended the fire station, a CFA activity or turned out on a CFA vehicle within 48 hours of symptoms beginning or a positive test, the Captain must notify the Rostered Duty Coordinator (RDC).

If there has been no fire station/activity/ vehicle exposures, all you need to do is notify the Captain and record your status on the website. **Booster Record with CFA** - CFA is also required to record your Covid Vaccination Third Dose (booster). Only the date of your booster shot is needed. You can input this yourself via the website or call/text me to complete it on your behalf.

Beat the bite this mosquito season - With summer in full swing, HRCC is monitoring mosquito numbers, locations and potential public health threats. See photo page 11.

Environmental Health Coordinator Luke Mitton said monitoring started in November and runs through to April each year. The wetlands around town are being treated with a larvicide and will prevent the mosquitoes from becoming adults. Stop Bindii before it seeds - Residents are being asked to contact HRCC if they notice Bindii on Council-managed property and to remove the weed from their own land to help stop its spread. It is very easily spread once the seeds form and the thorns stick to tyres and shoes and spread through parks, nature strips and lawns. See photo page 11. Council crackdown after attacks on sheep -HRCC is reminding dog owners of their responsibility to properly control their pets after sheep were

attacked on a farm near the edge of town. Community Safety Coordinator Jason Brady said HRCC had received reports about dogs roaming out of sight of their owners in semi-rural areas. Dog owners must take responsibility for their animal or they could be held liable.

Wonwondah Landcare Group






