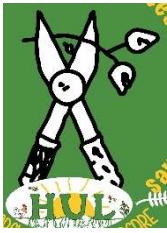

Next meeting on **Tuesday June 14** is a Casseroles, Conversations and Conservation evening at Laharum Hall. Please bring a casserole to share at 6pm, have a chat and watch a short film on 'Regenerating Australia' and stay for the meeting at 7.30pm. We will be collecting information so that we can map weeds, rabbits and other problems in order to coordinate effective action.

Some weeds like Bridal Creeper are growing really well. Unfortunately it has a huge root system so the most effective time to spray it is in early Spring (July/August?) when it is in bud or flower, so the plant takes the weedicide down into the roots. In the meantime, pull the vines away from precious plants so you can spray the weed carefully later.

Similarly, bulb weeds can be sprayed when in bud or early flower. Information and resources are available from Laharum Landcare Group.

She spoke about the Auxiliary, the funds it raises for Wimmera Hospice and the support Hospice gives for the comfort of others at the most trying time of their life. Jo Gellatly and Michelle Hallam have both taken secondments in Headquarters but will still work from Horsham.

Karen Friend has moved from Admin to part-time BASO in the West Wimmera Catchment. The process to appoint two new BASOs; one part time, one full time is currently underway. I remain in the Horsham Rural City Council Catchment.

We are expecting some new brigade owned vehicles to arrive in the district this year including the replacement Light Tanker for Laharum and new additions; Ultralight Tanker for Mitre and a Light Tanker for Nhill. Dimboola and Warracknabeal Fire Stations are currently under construction.

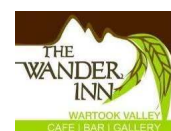

Council is planning for additional recycling services for urban and rural households across the municipality – saving thousands of tonnes of waste from landfill each year.

Under the State Government's Circular Economy Policy released in February 2020, all Victorian councils must introduce Food and Garden Organics (FOGO) collection for all urban households by 2030, and separate glass recycling collection by 2027. This will mean a four-bin system will be introduced across the State.

At the Council meeting on May 23, Council adopted a new Kerbside Collection Policy. This policy will govern how the new waste collection service will work, commencing **April 4, 2023**.

In summary, the service will include for Rural areas -

- A 240-litre general waste bin, collected fortnightly.
- A 240-litre mixed recycling bin, collected fortnightly (expanded to all rural properties with an existing waste collection service).
- New glass recycling drop-off locations across the municipality.

It's estimated that up to 40% of the municipality's household rubbish is food waste, which currently goes straight to landfill. When buried in landfill, food waste decomposes without oxygen, creating methane gas – which contributes to global warming.

Separating glass from other recycling will make recycling more efficient, and allow more glass to be recovered for recycling. Under the current system about 30% of glass cannot be recovered and broken glass fragments cause problems for other recycled materials.

Council looks to landowners for new gravel source –

Farmers with potential gravel resources on their properties could hold the key to improving rural roads as Horsham Rural City Council looks to establish new quarries in the municipality.

With the region's gravel supply becoming scarce, HRCC is contacting private landowners to see if they would be open to having their gravel resources excavated and used for road maintenance. Selected landowners would be contacted for interest.

Any agreements would be contract-based and subject to a range of conditions including being at least 100m away from any residential building.

Compensation such as royalties would be paid and land management and rehabilitation plans would be put in place. "Front of mind is the fact that this needs to be done with consideration to residents living in the vicinity of any potential new quarries," Mr Martin said.

Bumper Citizenship Ceremony - Twenty seven people from six different countries formally became Australians recently at one of the largest ever Citizenship Ceremonies at Horsham Rural City Council. Countries of origin included the Philippines, Papua New Guinea, India, Myanmar, Zimbabwe and South Africa.

Silo Art Grand Opening - On May 27, during National Reconciliation Week, the new 'Yangga Dyata – Walking on Country' Silo Artwork was opened with a smoking ceremony. See photo page 12.

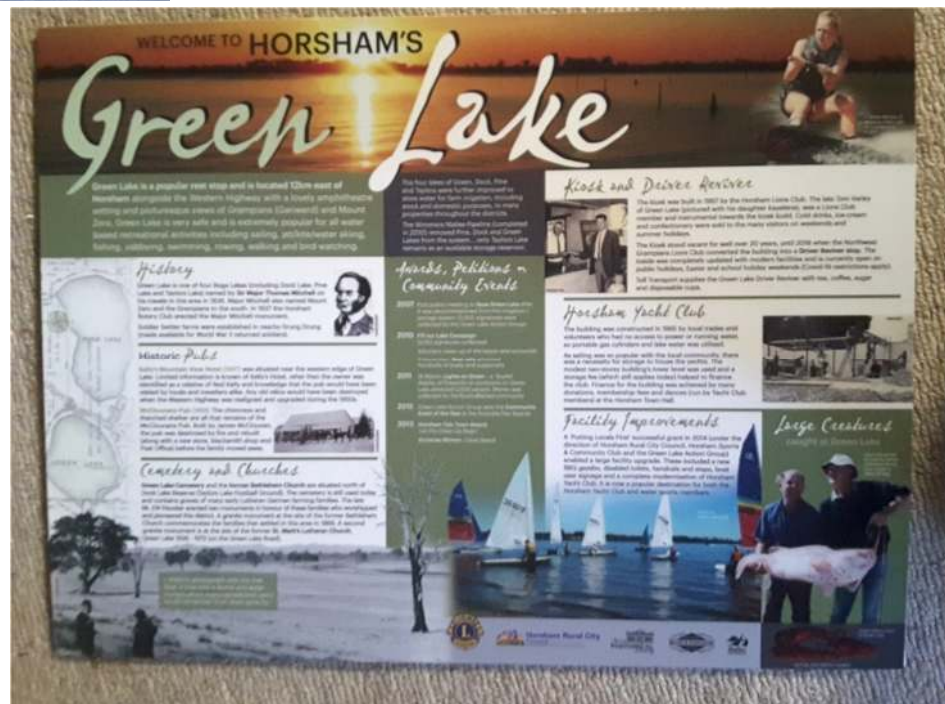
