

# \$1.7 million for 5G Horsham internet

the Victorian Government's \$1.7 million funding for enhanced high-speed broadband for Wimmera businesses.

Minister for Regional Development Jaala Pulford on Wednesday announced a partnership with Spirit Telecom that will give Horsham businesses access to the latest wireless infrastructure that will deliver symmetrical gigabit broadband.

The technology is designed to put Horsham's broadband technology on par with Melbourne and other major metropolitan centres in Australia.

Under the plan, the fixed-wireless service will cover all of Horsham including the Horsham CBD, Horsham enterprise park, aerodrome and freight terminal with speeds of up to one gigabit per second in both direc-

Executive Officer Sunil Bhalla Chief welcomed the opportunity for Horsham to be offered the pilot technology.

access for our existing businesses and agriculture. It will allow high-quality video conferencing and other emerging high bandwidth applications, making it easier to work remotely," Mr Bhalla said.

"It also means Horsham will become even more attractive for businesses looking to relocate or start up in regional centres.

"Residents can also choose to sign up to the new plans, and they will enjoy internet speeds that bridge the digital divide between metro and regional areas," he said.

Spirit Telecom says it will offer the service to businesses at prices significantly lower than currently available for business-grade broadband services in regional Victoria. These prices will be competitive with the best available in metropolitan Melbourne.

Horsham families will also benefit from the availability of faster speeds with residential plans likely to present much better value for money than current offers.

Spirit Telecom will build and maintain the network, which is being delivered as part of the State Government's Connecting Regional Communities Program.

Project construction is expected to be completed by the end of 2019 but the first services, available in limited areas, could be offered as soon as mid next year.

# **Bradbury Car Park tree to be replaced**

A hazardous tree in the centre of Horsham's Bradbury Car Park will be removed with a replacement tree to be planted in autumn.

Recently, limbs have fallen and damaged vehicles, creating a risk for users of the carpark that must be managed.

Horsham Rural City Council Director Infrastructure John Martin said the large Lemon Scented Gum is regarded as a significant tree and all options to save it have been

"The tree has been assessed twice by a Council arborist and once by an independent arborist who all recommended removal of the tree or exclusion of vehicles and pedestrians," Mr Martin said.

"Excluding pedestrians and vehicles from the area is not an option as the area required to be fenced would include up to 16 parking bays and at least one traffic lane would also need to be closed.

"Tree cabling, in which limbs in danger of falling are tied back to the trunk, is also not likely to be effective as even the smaller limbs that have fallen from this tree, and which are not suitable for cabling, are up to 100mm in diameter. Taking into account the height they fall from and their weight, they could cause a catastrophic incident.

"Lopping the tree to the degree necessary would damage the structural integrity of the tree and potentially create a greater risk of large parts of the tree falling," he said.

Mr Martin said a suitable replacement tree would be planted when conditions were suitable in autumn.

"This will be a Rose Gum (Angophora Costata) which is a large, wide and spreading tree that will grow to a height of between 15m and 25m," he said.

"In time, this will provide excellent shade for car park users."

### **BOATING EXEMPTION**

Horsham Rural City Council, the waterway manager for the Wimmera River (within the boundaries of Horsham Rural City), declare under section 203(3) of the Marine Safety Act 2010 (Vic) that person and vessels participating in the Horsham Dragon Boat Regatta event proposed by Dragon Boat Racing Victoria from 6:30am to 5.30pm on Sunday 4 November 2018 are exempt as follows: State Rules made under the Marine Act 1988:

- Clause 2(c) 5 knots within 50 metres of another vessel for competitors and
- rescue vessels;

  2. Clause 3(a) 5 knots within 50 metres of the water's edge for competitors and
- Clause 69.1 and 69.3 of Schedule 69 5 knot speed restriction zone and no

- Masters of rescue vessels must adhere to speed and distance rules unless undertaking a rescue operation to retrieve persons in distress, provide for their initial medical or other needs and deliver them to a place of safety
   The exemptions apply from 6:30am to 5.30pm on Sunday 4 November 2018 for the Wimmera River (within the boundaries of Horsham Rural City)
