



Wimmera Councils to advance gender equity

Four Wimmera Councils have received Victorian Government funding to improve the way they engage with the public so that a diversity of women's voices are better heard.

Horsham Rural City Council (HRCC) was successful in applying for the Free from Violence Local Government Grants scheme and will partner with the neighbouring Shires of West Wimmera, Hindmarsh and Yarriambiack to deliver the gender equity in community engagement project.

HRCC Chief Executive Officer Sunil Bhalla said the 12-month project would provide greater community participation in local planning and decision making processes.

"This project will lead the auditing and review of HRCC and partnering Councils current community engagement processes, including Council committees to identify broader community representation," Mr Bhalla said.

"Wimmera Councils are committed to improving and strengthening community engagement so that all of our community, particularly women and girls, can participate.

"It is important that we all work together to increasing awareness and develop a greater understanding in community engagement of how gender inequality can lead to violence against women.

"Gender inequality is the root cause of family violence and strategies that promote positive, equal and respectful relationships can help to prevent violence against women.

Mr Bhalla said preventing family violence was a key part of HRCC's Health and Wellbeing Policy.



HRCC says NO to family violence

Council has designed "say no to family violence" bumper stickers as part of White Ribbon's 16 Days of Activism.

The message will be displayed on Council's corporate and operations vehicles.

"The Wimmera has one of the highest rates of family violence in the state," Mayor Mark Radford said.

"These statistics are alarming and Council is taking a stand. What we want to say very clearly to our community is that any form of violence is completely unacceptable.

"Family violence is everyone's responsibility and we need to involve everyone in the conversation if we are to turn the statistics around," he said.

The 16 Days of Activism started last Friday (International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women) and ends on 10 December which is International Human Rights Day.
