Cleaning Up After a Disaster

Contact your insurance company as soon as possible to lodge a claim and seek guidance on the claims process.

Immediate Aftermath

- **Many things can pose risks to your health after disasters.** Disasters are dangerous and your safety should always be your first priority. Property can be replaced, people can't.
- **Do not return to your property until emergency services instruct you to.**

Cleaning Up

- **Document your damage as soon as possible to support your insurance claim – photos are the best method.**

Once you have documented damage, you can begin cleaning up.

- **If you suspect your property has sustained structural damage, leave it immediately and contact the SES.**
- **If water has entered the property, don't turn on the electricity** until it has been inspected by an electrician.
- Take photos before and make a list of damaged items, including the brand, model and serial number if you can when disposing of damaged items.
- Don't throw away items that could be repaired unless they pose a health risk.
- Speak to your insurer before you authorise any building work.
- **Do not drive a vehicle if it has suffered water damage.**
