

I hope everyone had an enjoyable Christmas and New Year period with family and friends.

This summer has been a bit of a weird one, with numerous rain events occurring. This not only held up harvest operations but has also brought forward summer weeds. The wet conditions have also increased the risk of hay stack fires, especially stacks that are not under cover.

Brigades from the Grampians Group have responded to two haystacks catching fire in the Green Lake and Wonwondah Brigades with reports of a few others being close to catching fire, but were monitored by farmers and pulled apart when required.

Just a friendly reminder to continue monitoring stacks either outside or under cover. There have been quite a few stacks across District 17 burnt from spontaneous combustion igniting stacks, either from baling with too much moisture or moisture from rainfall getting into the hay.

Harvest - With harvest wrapped up across the area, we hope farmers had a great year despite the weather interruptions. We want to thank everyone for their cooperation who 'ceased harvest' when conditions deteriorated. Across the Grampians Group, no harvest related fires were reported.

Storm Damage/Flooding/Fallen Trees & Branches

- As mentioned, this summer has brought many rain and storm events to our area. Just a reminder, if you come across trees/branches down over roads, to please call the SES on **132 500**. SES is the lead emergency service when it comes to storm damage either on roads or buildings. Calling that number will firstly report it to the SES to come and clean up, but also activate the police for traffic management. The SES or police will then activate Council or Vic Roads to assist with machinery to help clear off the road.

CFA can be called upon if a larger event occurs to assist SES. Like the other week when the storm went through the Brimpaen area which resulted in numerous trees and branches over the Henty Highway. If you believe the situation is a life threatening emergency, please call **000**.

Permits to Burn Off - Permits to burn off 'grass and stubble only' will once again be available for farmers to prepare paddocks for the upcoming cropping season; most likely from a similar time to last year in early March.

If farmers are already starting to prepare paddocks, just a reminder about the permit conditions which we presume will be the same this year as last year. A six metre mineral earth break (cleared of flammable material) around the perimeter of the planned area to be burnt and mineral earth break around trees or timber. Six metres is 6 metres! If you don't have that, and your burn-off gets away, you will be in breach of your permit and you face the penalties enforced under the CFA Act. We will let

everyone know when permits will be available via messages, local facebook groups as per previous years.

So far this summer, Laharum Brigade has responded to seven call-outs. Two have been unattended camp fires within the National Park which Forest Fire Management handled; a couple of lightning strikes in single trees; the haystack fires at Green Lake and Wonwondah, and the storm clean up at Brimpaen on the Henty Highway.

Once again we thank the volunteers amongst our community who continually respond to these callouts.

St John's Wort could continue to flower and seed so at least slash or mow if you can't spray. Saffron Thistle may also continue so at least destroy seed heads and flowers. Stinkwort is already a menace and needs to be controlled.

Weedy introduced grasses will be happily seeding unless controlled or removed. Laharum Landcare Group will be having at least another weed information day this year.

We have a nest box program and Bruce McInnes is currently installing nest boxes on member's properties. See photos page 12.


